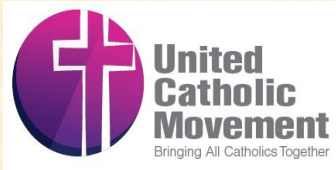


*A Word from Father Gerry*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



**United Catholic Movement**  
Over 200 people signed up to be “ambassadors” last Sunday. An “ambassador” agrees to pray for Catholics who do not attend Sunday Mass, invite an inactive Catholic to attend Sunday Mass or join other parishioners to learn best approaches to making that invitation.

Reaction to UCM has been overwhelmingly positive. The primary objective is to invite our brothers and sisters who do not attend Sunday Mass to renew their reception of the Sacraments. Another objective is to nourish among ourselves a culture where we are comfortable making that invitation.

Our UCM Leadership Team is planning a one-hour session for ambassadors to learn about resources, and best practices of how to offer an invitation to return to the practice of the faith. **These sessions will be in Kelley Hall from 10 – 11am on Saturday, May 6 or a session from 7 – 8pm on Tuesday, May 9.**

We’ll continue to act on these objectives and bring the parish up to date on the UCM. In the meantime, I hope every parishioner will participate in the UCM by at least praying that it will be a great blessing for those who are not regularly with us at Mass on Sunday and for our parish in general.

**Servers Awards**

Twenty young men and women who serve St. Joseph Parish as Altar Servers were awarded the Altar Server’s Award by the Serra Club of Northern Kentucky. All twenty are in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade of our Parish School of religion or our school. They will wear the blue Serra Club band when they serve.

This award acknowledges their tremendous service on behalf of the worship and prayer life of our parish. In addition to Sunday Mass, they assist at weddings, funerals, prayer services and other liturgical events. We should also thank their parents for the support they give to their sons’ and daughters’ service at the altar.

In last week’s bulletin, I overlooked the great stewardship of the Catholic Order of Forester members who prepared the meal for our parish Seder on Holy Thursday. 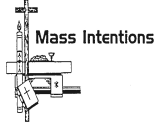

**SCRIPTURE REFLECTION**

Luke continues one of the themes John presents in the Easter Gospel: Things are not always as they seem. The two disciples did not recognize Jesus. They thought he was just another traveler, and a fairly uninformed one at that. Some scholars think the sun was in their eyes as they headed west to Emmaus in the evening. When Jesus approached them the light of the setting sun may have obscured their view of him. Even though the disciples did not recognize Jesus at first, they struck up a friendly enough relationship with the stranger to ask him to stay for dinner. They must have had some "gut-level" feeling about this person's character.

As they walked, they wondered with their traveling companion how God could have abandoned their friend, Jesus. They recalled those who jeered, "If he cannot save himself, how can he save others?" The disciples were beginning to ask the same question, since all hope now seemed lost.

Finally, when they shared the meal with their "new" friend, they began to see the truth—the everlasting truth about what had taken place. They began to understand that in order to share in the promised glory, they had to put their faith and hope in the risen Christ, whom at last they recognized.
