We have reached 133% of our goal!

THANK YOU everyone who has contributed

to the 2017 DPAA so far. Your contribution is helping many people who count on Diocesan ministries and services to receive the help that makes a huge positive difference for them. As of June 16, five hundred and fourteen parish households have given or pledged \$159,684; 133% of our \$120,000 goal.

From now on every new contribution to the DPAA will be rebated back to the parish without Diocesan assessments. Our 2017 DPAA rebate will be combined with the 2016 DPAA rebate of over \$50,000 and set aside to build an elevator on the southeast corner of the church.

An elevator will give no-step access to the church from the lower parking lot and between levels. This will allow persons with handicaps to more easily attend services in church and events on the lower level, such as meetings and coffee and doughnuts in Kelley Hall.

If you have not yet contributed to the DPAA, I ask you to please make a contribution on behalf of the ministry of our Diocese and the good of our parish. DPAA envelopes can be found in the brochure racks.

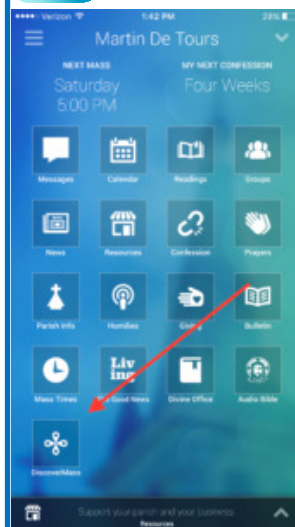

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Sometimes it seems that the more material possessions we have the more we are a slave to them. Think of your car. If it's an old beater, it takes just enough maintenance to keep it running. It requires minimal insurance, not much soap and polish, and theft protection is unnecessary. But, if you just purchased a car that cost more than your first house, you can bet it will be in a garage, insured extensively, equipped with anti-theft devices, and cleaned and polished often. Easier than any of this would be to ride a horse ... or a donkey colt.

Zechariah shows us that the king will come victoriously in peace riding humbly on a donkey colt. He has no need to flaunt his greatness. As a matter of fact, this king will do away with all that the world has come to know as greatness. He will do away with chariots and war horses.

So what does it mean for us to serve this king? He demands one thing of us: love. We must love God, our neighbors, and our enemies. This is not a crushingly heavy load for those with humble hearts. Jesus gives us a yoke of constraint, but also gives us the grace to carry it. We are never alone with the burden of Jesus.
