P.S. The DPAA rebate program returns to the parish 100% of pledges collected over our parish goal and are not subject Diocesan assessment. To date, 2017 monthly rebates have reached \$57,507. Rebates will be put aside for our GROW/Elevator fund.

An elevator will give no-step access to the church building by providing significantly more handicap parking in the lower lot. It will also allow persons with handicaps to move more easily from one level of the church building to another.

We hope to soon contract with an architectural firm to obtain precise material, engineering and construction costs for the elevator. We will continue to use DPAA rebates and other specified donations to build the Elevator Fund until the whole cost is in hand.

Your contribution to the 2018 DPAA will help with the many Diocesan ministries and allow many parishioners to participate more fully in parish life and worship.
