



**2019 Diocesan Parish Update as of May 9th**

Thank you to the 459 parish households who have given or pledged \$140,248 toward our parish goal of \$107,500. All of the funds collected by the DPAA over our pledge amount are rebated back to the parish without Diocesan assessment.

Our parish rebate project is to make repairs to our 60 year old pipe organ. In all that time it has had no repairs beyond the most essential. The leather pouches, which hold the air and push it through the pipes, are drying out and cracking. If these pouches tear, the organ will be unusable. The organ's electrical wiring is also 60 years old and needs to be replaced. The cost of these repairs is expected to be about \$150,000. The organ actually needs more than these repairs. We will set aside DPAA rebates for this purpose until all the funds needed are collected.

If you have not contributed to this year's DPAA, I ask you to give prayerful consideration to making a contribution. A gift of any amount will come back to the parish once our goal amount is collected. You will also contribute to the larger mission of the Church in our Diocese.

**SCRIPTURE REFLECTION**



The readings for the Easter season hearken back to the first days of Christianity. As we read them, we walk in the footsteps of the first Christians as they try to figure out what it means to follow Christ.

It isn't as if they had all the rules spelled out for them in some sort of "Be a Christian" manual. They had to rely on the working of the Holy Spirit for guidance and discernment. Take one of the first major questions facing the developing church: Do Christians have to be circumcised? Circumcision was an essential part of the Old Covenant, but was it necessary in the New Covenant of Jesus? After prayerful consideration, the leaders decided that no, circumcision wasn't necessary.

That model of discerning the will of God for the Church continues to this day. The Holy Spirit is with the successors of the apostles: the bishops and Pope, the Magisterium of the Church. In accord with Jesus' promise not to leave us alone, the Spirit remains active even to the present time.

So what does this mean to us? It means that through the teachings of the Church, we can be certain that we are following the authentic teachings of Jesus. We can trust that, with the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit, the Church is passing on and protecting those teachings. That's why we need the Catholic Church—to help guide our lives so that we might save our souls for eternity and live happy and fulfilled lives today.

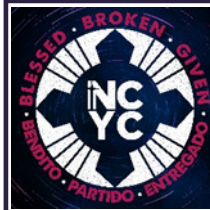
