Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Eucharistic Devotions

This weekend the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for Adoration from the end of 5pm Mass on Saturday until 10pm Night Prayer and again following the 11:30 Mass on Sunday until the 4pm Solemn Closing and Benediction.

Our annual Eucharistic Devotions give us an opportunity, as a parish community, to highlight the central mystery of our faith; that Christ continues to be present to us in the Eucharistic life of the Church.

Spending time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament helps deepen our awareness of this gift of faith, which, in turn, helps us live the faith we profess. This is what the Church means when it calls the Eucharist “*the source and summit*” of our life in Christ.

I encourage you to spend some time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. This does not require specific prayers or anything but your willingness to give some time to be with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. This devotion can help you grow spiritually through quiet intimacy with the Lord.

A short visit before the Blessed Sacrament and attending the Solemn Closing of Eucharist Devotions is a great way for parents to root their families in the traditions of our Catholic faith.

Solemn Closing of Eucharistic Devotions will include a homily by Fr. Harry Settle and Benediction. We will also have a Eucharistic procession (outside if weather permits) to symbolize our conviction that our Eucharistic faith is not confined to church buildings but is expressed by our lives in the world.

Please join the parish in participating in Eucharistic Devotions.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Now, why don't we just consider this as a good old protracted proverb that can be used for one of those get-rich seminars we read about in the newspapers? Because the silver pieces of this parable stand for the Christian's responsibility as a citizen of heaven and of this world. The two responsibilities are one. We are to be engaged in this world of people—the ones on buses and sidewalks and in skyscrapers as well as those on small main streets and in country stores and at home. Let us remember the question facing the early community, for it is the question that we must face: How do we wait, and how do we go on? Is this a paradox?

Paul simply tells us in the second reading that we don't know when the reign of God will come, nor should we be overly worried about it. His image of the thief in the night focuses on the unexpected. To be always wary is impossible. We'll end up on edge; eventually we will let down our guard. Paul reminds us that we live in the daylight of the Resurrection. We are called to the open, fearless engagement of the wise investors and the valiant woman of the first reading. We are not to cringe fearfully in the dark as one who fails to realize his or her own ability and responsibility, as one who buries everything in a dark hole.

Saint of the Week

St. Elizabeth of Hungary

(1207-1231)

Memorial: November 17



St. Elizabeth of Hungary was the daughter of the King of Hungary and was married at age 14 to Louis of Thuringia, with whom she had 3 children. She led a life of prayer, sacrifice and service to the poor and the sick, and wore simple clothing although as royalty, she could have led a life of luxury. Her husband died in the crusades and his family threw her out of the palace because she was squandering the royal money on feeding bread to the hungry daily and caring for the poor and sick. In 1228 she joined the Secular Franciscan Order and spent the rest of her life caring for the sick in a hospital she founded in honor of St. Francis. She died before her 24th birthday. St. Elizabeth of Hungary is the patron saint of bakers and is also the patroness of Catholic Charities and of the Secular Franciscan Order.

The Saint Elizabeth Hospitals in Northern Kentucky are named after St. Elizabeth of Hungary. The original hospital was founded in 1861 by two activist women and the St. Elizabeth Support Guild and was originally staffed by the Franciscan Sisters of the Poor.
