Here is an excerpt from what St. Joseph religion teacher Darla Dressman wrote about the saints, which was printed in the bulletin at the beginning of the school year:

*All of us have heroes. They are the people we look up to and want to be like. Saints are considered to be heroes of the church. They are holy people that put God and his will first, and treat people as Jesus would. Most saints are known for the way they helped the poor, the sick, and the outcast. No two saints are alike. We will discover that saints are men, women, boys, and girls. They come from all corners of the world and have many different backgrounds and talents. Saints show us how to live as children of God. They inspire us to use our gifts and talents for the good of others. This year our theme is "Soaring Into Sainthood." We will discover different saints throughout the year and how they served God and others. We know that our friends on earth pray for us and other people all the time. The saints are our heavenly friends that pray for us any time we ask them to because they never stop loving and caring for us. Let us dedicate this year to look to the saints so we can put Jesus first and let God strengthen us to do marvelous things for him and for others.*



**Saint of the Week**  
**St. Charles Borromeo**  
 (1538-1584)  
 Memorial: November 4



St. Charles lived during the time of the Protestant Reformation and was involved in the reform of the Church at the Council of Trent. His uncle, Pope Pius IV, appointed him cardinal-deacon administrator of the Diocese of Milan while he was still a young layman. At the age of 25 he was ordained a priest and consecrated bishop of Milan. During a plague and famine in Milan he stayed to minister to the hungry, sick, and dying when many civil leaders fled. St. Charles Borromeo is the patron saint of catechists, catechumens, and seminarians.

### SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



It is not for us to decide what shape our death takes. Life, however, is a different matter. It is for us to receive life as it is given to us; or, more actively, it is for us to decide how to meet the life that surrounds and summons us. Jesus does not call us to live a life delivering messages or bristling with judgment and moral condemnation or burning with self-righteous fury. No. These behaviors are essentially self-seeking and will only yield isolation. As Paul reminds us, we have already been bought and paid for. We have already been born into the resurrection of the One into whose death we were baptized. We are asked to enter into the life we have already been given—the crucified and Risen One.

This is an accessible and possible life. It is not grand and high-flying; it is close to the earth. It involves the person who needs a helping hand, the person who stands at the door of our house or heart. We are just asked to die to all that is less, to forgo all that is demeaning and small and isolating—all that is death. We are called to life.
