

A Word From Father Gerry

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Someone sent me a cartoon showing a little boy in a restaurant with his father who has his wallet out to pay the bill. The little boy asks his father, "How come the waitress gets 15% and God only gets 10%?" The father has that "I never thought about that" look on his face.

Most people don't think about what we spend on other things compared to our tithe to God. Religion is not a commodity or product to purchase but a commitment to the mission of Jesus Christ. Our "tithe" refers to all donations to our parish and other organizations that support the work of Jesus Christ.

It is worth thinking about our tithe to the Sunday offering at St. Joseph Parish compared to what we casually spend on many other things; a cup of coffee, a movie, monthly internet/cable service. I'm not suggesting we give up these things. I am suggesting we think about the priority and commitment we give to the mission of Jesus Christ as we carry it out here at St. Joseph. I want us to reflect on what it means to "belong to St. Joseph Parish".

This weekend we are distributing the Annual Financial Stewardship Report. It shows that our Sunday offertory is not meeting the costs of carrying out our ministries, programs and activities. Each one of these has an impact on fellow parishioners and those who benefit from our outreach. Our buildings have reached the point of requiring upgrading to be safe and comfortable.

I am asking each of us who belong to St. Joseph Parish to make a personal commitment and do our best to increase our financial support of the Sunday offertory; not for the sake of buildings and programs themselves, but for the sake of those who use them to grow in their knowledge, love and service of the Lord. That way, our "belonging" is in fact a sharing in the mission of the parish.

Please consider what level of tithing to the parish is right for you. Consider how you have been blessed by the Lord. Consider how you wish to help the St. Joseph Parish community fulfill its mission.

Many parishioners are doing all they can. On behalf of the parish, I thank you for your generosity. Many other parishioners know they could do more. On behalf of those who are blessed by the parish I encourage you to take a greater share in our mission. In either case, I thank you for reading this letter and promise that the parish staff and I will do all we can to help you in your journey of faith.

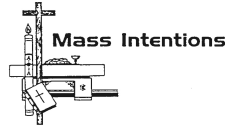

Sacrament of Penance: Saturdays, before and after the 8:30 a.m. Mass, Saturday afternoon between 3:00 - 4:00 p.m. (unless there is a 3:00 p.m. Wedding) and by appointment.

Rosary: Monday thru Friday at 7:05 a.m. and after 8:30 a.m. Mass. Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. before Benediction. Saturday after the 8:30 a.m. Mass and on Sunday morning before the 9:30 a.m. Mass. The Patriotic Rosary every Wednesday at 3:00 p.m.
