### A Word From Father Gerry

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Jesus often used money in his parables to teach about discipleship (e.g. tenants and talents, the rich fool, dishonest steward, rich man and Lazarus, camel passing through eye of a needle, ten gold coins). Our use of money says something about our values, our priorities and, ultimately, our Christian discipleship.

Our parish is very busy place with multiple activities and programs scheduled on any given day. Christian discipleship is not a call to be busy, but to be faithful to the gospel values. The annual financial report being distributed today is also a report of our desire to be faithful stewards of God's gifts.

We have been greatly blessed by one benefactor's generosity, which has allowed us to establish the St. Joseph Parish Catholic Education Endowment. Interest from the endowment provides direct tuition assistance to qualifying families, it helps reduce tuition increases and returns funds to the endowment. We hope parishioners will want to build on this legacy in their own estate plans. We have also been blessed by the generosity of parishioners when there is a particular need, especially for capital improvements.

Our day-to-day ministries, programs and activities are funded by the Sunday Offertory collection. Most of these good works are accomplished by generous parish volunteers. Still, the parish mission cannot operate without personnel and facilities, which require substantial and regular financing.

Our current Sunday Offertory collections are not keeping pace with our financial requirements. I am asking all of us to make a personal commitment to increase our level of parish support, so that we can meet expenses and ministry needs. I personally commit myself to honor your stewardship by a responsible use of your contributions of time, talent and treasure.

Carrying out this gospel mission requires the financial involvement of the whole parish, to the full extent of our ability. Your contribution to the Sunday Offertory collection provides the funding needed to accomplish this mission. *THANK YOU* for the financial support you have given.

#### DIOCESAN / PARISH ANNUAL APPEAL UPDATE

Thank you, for contributing to the 2014 DPAA. So far, 588 households have made gifts and pledges amounting to \$149,941 toward our 2014 DPAA goal of \$117,500. If all the pledges are met, St. Joseph Parish will receive a rebate of \$32,441. The Diocese sends rebate checks once the parish goal has been met and contributions are received from parishioners. We have already received \$3,740 as the first portion of our rebate.

Any additional gifts to the DPAA on the parish's behalf will increase the rebate amount. DPAA rebates are not subject to Diocesan assessment. Additional gifts can be placed in an envelope marked "DPAA 2014" and dropped in the Sunday Offertory collection or sent to the rectory.

We will use our rebate to help with the cost of making repairs and improvements to our parish grounds and facilities. For example, the parking lots in front of the gym and around Memorial Hall still have to be resurfaced.

Among other services, the DPAA helps many agencies in the Diocese provide shelter, food and support at times of crisis. It provides for the care of retired priests and formation of seminarians. The rebate program helps our parish with the cost of maintaining our grounds and facilities. Your contribution really makes a difference to the Diocesan services and the parish.
