Dear brothers and sisters,

The deacons, priests and staff of St. Joseph are aware of what a joy it is to minister to you, and to others in your name. A quick look at the back page of our annual report, inserted in this bulletin, gives some indication of why I say this. We count being able to serve here at St. Joseph one of our own reasons we are grateful to God. So I can assure you of our prayers for special blessings on Thanksgiving Day.

Thanksgiving gives us an opportunity to be especially mindful of God's goodness and the bounty that we enjoy. SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

We might ask, why this difficult Gospel? Is this the Church's idea of saving the best story until last? Here is God's chosen one, right here, stretched between heaven and earth. He is surrounded by second-rate rulers who jeer and swagger so knowingly. And here is one criminal who wants to get off easy, a con man to the last. And here is the other, the unnamed one, the one who uses the precious little energy and time he has left to seek repentance. What does he see in Jesus?

Apparently, he sees a king, a Messiah, a righteous one. The thief stands in sharp contrast to rest of the hangers-on Luke mentions. The thief asks to share in the reign of God, a reign that is not geographical. Jesus spoke about this earlier in his public life: "The coming of the kingdom of God cannot be observed, and no one will announce, 'Look, here it is,' or, 'There it is.' For behold, the kingdom of God is among you." (Luke 17:20-21) This unlikely place is not God-forsaken—just the opposite. It is God's power manifest, and the thief is the first to see it. He is already home. "This day" he is in paradise, the place of the just.

One cannot get any more inclusive than this. The one outside the walls of Jerusalem, outside the civic laws of Rome, presumably without friend or family, is offered a share in royalty. The all-inclusiveness of Jesus' pardon of this man tells us what we need to know about the dimensions of the reign of God. The story of the convict made "good" offers us a clear picture of the kind of king Jesus Christ is.
