Eucharistic Devotions

We will be celebrating our annual parish **Eucharistic Devotions from Friday, November 14 through Sunday, November 16**. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on the altar for adoration and personal devotions at these times:

Friday, November 14 10am until 10pm Night Prayer
 Saturday, November 15 9am until 10pm Night Prayer
 (except 4 – 6pm for Mass)
 Sunday, November 16 following 11:30am Mass
 until 4pm Solemn Closing and Benediction

We want to be sure someone is present while the Blessed Sacrament is exposed, so a **sign-up sheet is in the main church vestibule to schedule yourself**. Of course, you do not have to be scheduled to make a visit.

Our annual Eucharistic Devotions give us an opportunity, as a parish community, to highlight the central mystery of our faith; that Christ continues to be present to us in the Eucharistic life of the Church.

Spending time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament helps deepen our awareness of this gift of faith, which, in turn, helps us live the faith we profess. This is what the Church means when it calls the Eucharist “*the source and summit*” of our life in Christ.

I encourage you to schedule some time during Eucharistic Devotions for coming to church to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. This does not require specific prayers or anything but giving time to be with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Spending as little as 10 minutes before the Blessed Sacrament can help you grow spiritually through quiet intimacy with the Lord. A short visit in church before the Blessed Sacrament can leave children with a life-long impression of closeness to the Lord. A short visit before the Blessed Sacrament and attending the Solemn Closing of Eucharist Devotions is a great way for parents to root their families in the traditions of our Catholic faith.

A Solemn Closing of Eucharistic Devotions at 4pm on Sunday, November 16, will include a homily by Fr. Harry Settle and Benediction. It will also include a procession (outside if weather permits) to symbolize our conviction that our Eucharistic faith is not confined to church buildings but is expressed by our lives in the world.

Please give some time to participating in Eucharistic Devotions. It will surely come back to bless you.

Memorial Mass and Ministry Dinner

Last Monday’s Memorial Mass for those who died in the past year and last Wednesday’s Ministry Dinner prompted my gratitude to those who give themselves to the liturgical ministries of the parish.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Once upon a time, two men, day after day, worked side by side in brick and mortar. Each day a child passed by and always stopped a moment to watch the two men work. Day after day, the course of bricks grew higher and higher, but the child could not tell what the men were constructing. The child did notice, however, that while both of the men worked at the same pace and with the same expertise, one seemed always sad, the other always happy. One day the child's curiosity got the better of him. He timidly approached the sad-looking man and asked, "What are you doing?"

The fellow barely took his eyes off the ground as he growled, "I'm laying bricks, that's what," and went on with his work.

The child then turned to the happy-looking man and asked him the same question. The man smiled broadly, pointed a finger to the sky, and exclaimed, "I'm building a cathedral, that's what!"

When living our lives and building our "temple," what are we doing? What are we about? Laying bricks, or building a cathedral?

Today's liturgy reminds us that we are God's temples. God's own Spirit resides in us. God's own Son is our foundation. The liturgy thus challenges us to build cathedrals. Let us respond, one brick at a time.

Saint of the Week
St. Frances Xavier Cabrini
(1850-1917)
Memorial: November 13



St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was born in Italy, became a teacher at age 18, took religious vows in 1877 at the age of 27 and became the Mother Superior of the House of Providence orphanage. In 1880 the orphanage closed, and she and 7 other women founded the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. She composed the rules and constitution of the order and was the superior general until her death. Mother Cabrini's dream was to be a missionary in China, but Pope Leo XIII sent her to New York City in 1889 where she founded an orphanage. She founded 67 institutions in major US cities and in South America and Europe to care for the poor, the uneducated and the sick. She became a US citizen in 1909. She died in 1917 of complications from malaria. Her remains, which are allegedly incorrupt, are enshrined on display under glass at St. Frances Cabrini Shrine in Manhattan, NY. Mother Cabrini is the first US Citizen to be canonized a saint and is the patron saint of hospital administrators, immigrants, and impossible causes.

Mother Cabrini was chosen to be represented in the icons in the sanctuary of our parish church because of the many immigrants in the parish at the time our church was built.
