REFLECTION... BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

Today's Gospel is clearly an instruction on the Eucharist and on what Jesus intends it to be: nourishment for Christian communities. Just prior to the scene depicted in the Gospel, Jesus has sent out his apostles to proclaim the reign of God and to heal. This they did, going from village to village, preaching and curing. Upon their return, they report to Jesus. Then, suddenly, it is Jesus who is again preaching and curing. Withdrawing to Bethsaida, Jesus finds himself engulfed by a crowd of people. He welcomes them and goes on to preach and cure the sick. But then, Jesus adds something new to the mission of his disciples: they must feed those who follow him. If they can preach and heal as Jesus does, then they must also nourish those who hear the Word and form them into communities.

Note how Luke arranges the scene. The apostles want to dismiss the crowd so that the people can find their own food and shelter. Jesus asks the Twelve why they don't feed the crowd themselves. The apostles complain that all they have are five loaves and two fish. How can this little feed so many? Jesus tells them how. First Jesus divides the crowd into smaller groups/communities. Then he performs the blessing/breaking/giving formula of Eucharist. However, Jesus himself does not distribute the food. Rather, he instructs his apostles to do that. The people have all they want to eat, with twelve baskets of leftovers. In other words, the Lord provides nourishment generously and abundantly.

Luke is saying: Not just during that evening in Galilee, not just when Jesus blesses and breaks the bread, but whenever followers gather in his name to share his table, whenever his ministers speak his words over the bread, Jesus Christ is present to nourish his followers and to make them one. What happened then happens now.
